We are writing to object to the planning application for change of use to multi-purpose community use including place of worship (Class D1) for these reasons:

The unauthorised use of the church last year worsened the parking situation in our street (Howden) and the surrounding area. As it is, at the moment, our street has no residents permit parking and thus is already an area used by commuters into town, making parking from 8am – 7pm very challenging. We feel that the presence of a community centre on the site of the former factory would exacerbate this problem.

We also feel that the change of use would lead to an increase in levels of noise emanating from the site. We have two small children and in the summer months windows are often left open for additional ventilation. We feel that under these conditions any additional noise would disrupt their sleep.

Additionally, access to the site is limited to entrances on Howden and Nutbrook streets. These are narrow, pass under resident's properties and are unsuitable for an increase in traffic.

The amount of extra vehicles and people using the proposed facility will have a detrimental impact upon the local streets. Parking is already a problem, as is increasing vehicular useage in the area. I would like to object strongly to the proposed changes to the use of 33 Nutbrook Street. The breadth of the application is so broad I do not propose to take up each point. I will nevertheless make some general comments about the applicationn.

Nutbrook street is a quiet residential street where a number of children, elderly and disabled people live. The use of the space as a community cetre will increase the number of people and cars using the street at all times of day/evening and weekends.

there is not the parking capacity for this. last year when the site was being used as a church there was no parking and even reserved disabled spaces where occupied, the noise levels on the street were increased to the point of being anuisance and litter was left scattered everywhere, i even found a used nappy thrown in front of my gate, the number of people walking up and down the street was staggering and we first thought that it was a wedding party so festive and noisy was the atmosphere, i believe increase circulation would pose a danger to children crossing the road, and a number of children use the street to get to neighbouring schools.

As far as my property is concerned i also worry about safety, increased noise and passage makes it easier for burglars to get in. I would feel vulnerable in my own home.

the neighboorhood is full of churches and community centres. Surely another spot could be found and we could avoid nuisance of the kind experienced next to Peckham rye train station up to recently. There also appears to be no evidence offered for the local need for these services or survey of what is already provided.

the application is also worded in very general terms and it is not clear what kind of services will be offered e.g. counselling could cover many activities, also if childcare is to be provided is an open air area not needed, that would increase noise. And what about fire safety assessment.

here are the kind of concerns i have - as i said this is not exhaustive but so broad is tha epplication that it makes it difficult to address all issues succintly or image every use for which the centre might be used.
